



GAGA WHAT IS GAGA BALL?

For many reasons, gaga ball is a game that both challenges and includes kids of many abilities. The game involves using a pit, either on solid ground or sand. Two teams use their hands to tap the ball toward someone to tag them out. The only way to get someone out is to hit them anywhere below the waist—if it touches the arms, face, or stomach, it doesn't count,

HOW TO PLAY GAGA BALL

Gaga ball is a strategic game with fair rules. The first rule is to have both teams inside the pit and away from the ball. Ensure they're in a ready position. A chosen player from either team throws the ball up, and everyone shouts "ga" twice as it bounces on the ground. On the second bounce, that's when you know the ball is in play.
